This was to demonstrate the old style mast ascent with bosun's chair. The contrast was the new BIRDS BOSUN'S LADDER which briefly is a rope ladder that goes by slides up the mast track pulled by the halyard and The advantages are : Light; compact; rigid; allows mast to be climbed if necessary single handed with a harness line around the mast but also simply with one other to tend a bosun's chair line for long spells. No hauling needed, Ladies, and much cheaper than mast steps, so you may get those front room curtains at last. #### ELECTRICS

I had trouble with charging the batteries on 'OFFENBACH', the control unit cut the charge rate to virtually nothing soon after starting the motor and long before either battery was fully charged. The alternator, the control unit and the batteries were all suspected as were the battery terminal connections. The fault was eventually traced to the small junction box where the heavy negative cables from each battery and the alternator are joined together. Poor contacts here when cleaned and remade solved the problem completely.
